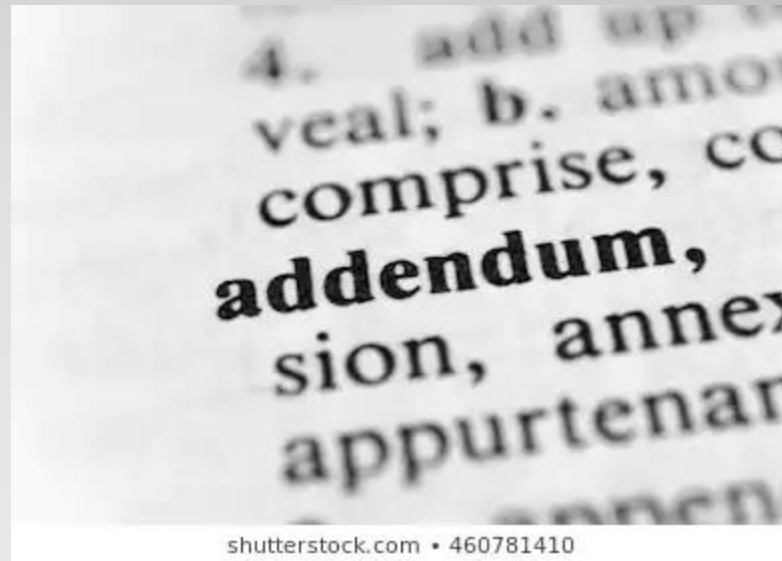

Funding Source	Estimated Maximum Available	Estimated Time Period Funds Available	Eligible Uses Under this Super NOFA
ESG RRH	\$ 121,325.00	April 1, 2020 – March 30,2021	Any eligible activities related to Rapid Re-housing. Expansion of existing RRH, establishment of new RRH, funding RRH that has operated successfully and will be expiring. The BCHCoC may recommend two proposals for funding. Up to 10% of the funds can be used in each category for street outreach, homelessness prevention, and HMIS.
ESG Competitive	\$ 400,000.00	April 1, 2020 – March 30,2021	Any eligible activities related to Emergency Shelter including but not limited to capital , operating and/or service supports. This is one-year funding only. <u>The BCHCoC may submit two proposals to the Northern region's competitive pool. THERE is a \$75,000 min grant amount and a \$200,000 maximum grant amount.</u>
CESH Round 1	\$ 401,060.00	August 1, 2019 – July 30, 2023	CESH funds may be requested for capital , operating and/or services supports for emergency shelters. CESH funds can be expended over a five-year period. The BCHCoC reserves the right to award planning grants in combination with conditional shelter awards in order to bring an applicant into compliance with state requirements .All capital, operating and/or support funds would be utilized starting at the end of the planning grant period.
CESH Round 2	\$ 226,060.00	August 1, 2020 – July 30, 2024	CESH funds may be requested for capital , operating and/or services supports for emergency shelters. CESH funds can be expended over a five-year period.
HEAP Funds	\$ 450,000.00	August 1, 2019 – May 31, 2021	HEAP funds may be requested for capital, operating and/or services supports for emergency shelters.

Addendum Date: July 2, 2019

Include Signed Addendum

- Grant writing is a step-by-step process. It takes time and persistence to succeed.
- After you have written a proposal, it could take a year to receive the funds needed to implement your project or program.
- Even a perfectly written proposal may be turned down, no matter the merits of its purpose.
- Accept the outcome. Whether you receive the funding or not, you can learn from every proposal. Accept the outcome and take time to reflect upon the process. Make a list of what you learned and how it will help you with grant proposals in the future.

It's a Process.... Take Your Time

Learn, Read, Understand

- Use information you have written for other projects
- **Show why you deserve it.** Don't be afraid to share your success stories by using examples of how grant money has helped you help your community in the past. Funding sources are more willing to award grant money to nonprofits with a successful track record.
- **Proofread and then proofread again.** Too many nonprofits skip this step, but if your writing isn't up to par, the grant reader is less likely to consider the submission. After you've reviewed your work, recruit the help of a colleague or expert editor to assure your grammar is top-notch.

Do Not Re-create the Grant

Program description and evaluation:

- For the project you would like to pursue grant funds, are you prepared to outline or verbally describe:
 - Methods, curriculum, and key tasks and timelines for delivering intended services *
 - Unique/innovative strategies, including research or rationale to substantiate the approach
 - Clear delineation of staff responsibilities
 - Can you name at least two tools you plan to use to track outcomes and objectively measure success? *
 - Do you have evaluation data that objectively demonstrates that your project has been successful?

Collaboration/uniqueness/niche

- Does your organization share resources or integrate services with at least two other agencies? *
- Can you name two reasons why a grantor would award a grant to your organization rather than to an organization that provides similar services?

Self - Assessments

Financial management and other fundraising

- Can you create financial reports and budgets to respond to grant requirements?
- Do you have cash reserves that can support your expenses for three to six months?
- In addition to grants, do you plan to raise at least 50% of your budget from non-grant funds?
- Did the nonprofit receive more money last year than it spent?
- Are your financial statements professionally prepared by an accountant?
