2026 HHAP Annual Report through December 31, 2025

Instructions

California Health and Safety Code sections [50221](#), [50222](#) and [50223](#) detail the annual and final report requirements to demonstrate fiscal and programmatic outcomes for all rounds of the [Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention \(HHAP\)](#). Grantees are required to submit an annual report by April 1 each year following an award of funding covering the activity through the prior calendar year (CY) and are required to submit a final report due April 1 following the 100% expenditure deadline reporting on activity through the prior CY. The final report requires the same content as the annual report but should include a final summary of activities completed under the grant. All annual and final reports submitted by grantees will be made publicly available on HCD's website.

Annual vs. Final Report: This 2026 HHAP Annual Report Form serves as the annual report for HHAP Rounds 2 through 5, and the final report for HHAP Round 1.

Reporting Timeframe: In this 2026 annual report, grantees should report all cumulative program activity through December 31, 2025. The Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) allows HHAP grantees to begin spending HHAP as of the date of their respective Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) after HCD has made the award. HHAP Round 5 grantees, all of which were awarded during CY 2024, should report activity beginning as of the date of the [HHAP 5 NOFA](#), September 29, 2023.

Report Scope: The HHAP annual report allows each Administrative Entity to submit a single report covering all five rounds of HHAP that have been awarded. The report must cover activities funded by all rounds that the Administrative Entity administers.

Implementation of an open HMIS

Butte County, as the HMIS Lead and CoC Lead Agency, worked to implement a major shift in HMIS - making the local HMIS an open system. In order to accomplish this, the County worked closely with the HMIS vendor as well as local stakeholders to ensure understanding and buy-in. Most importantly, the County engaged with people with current and previous lived experience of homelessness; their insight led to this system shift.

Timeframe of Accomplishment

2022 through 2024

Impact of Accomplishment

HMIS now functions in a much more trauma-informed way. With an open system, if opted in, all data and case notes follow the client. The client no longer has to repeat the same sensitive demographic data or retell their history and barriers each time they seek services. Additionally, the client has more freedom to move throughout the system as they see fit, with each case manager being able to pick up where the last left off, without losing time and extending the client's instance of homelessness.

Due to this, most service providers in Butte County have opted into HMIS, increasing communication between agencies and improving data quality, leading to a more effective continuum of services. Most importantly clients are able to be given non-duplicative referrals and more impactful assistance.

Helped fund the construction of the region's only AB 101 compliant new navigation center; a one stop place for housing and ancillary services in a centralized location near other supports for individuals experiencing homelessness and at-risk of homelessness.

Timeframe of Accomplishment

May 2022 through November 2025

Impact of Accomplishment

People experiencing and at-risk of homelessness now have a centralized location to access a variety of services within walking distance of other services and amenities as well as emergency shelters. Additionally, the Navigation Center is connected to the Torres Shelter, providing visitors with direct access to emergency shelter. The Navigation Center houses representatives from a variety of local non-profit and government resources; there are also conference rooms available to schedule group and individual meetings.

With streamlined and centralized access to services, more people will become housed avoid entering homelessness, especially if they connect to numerous rapid rehousing and diversion programs. Additionally, the Navigation Center is attached to the county's largest homeless shelter, thus reducing the length of time individuals are staying in emergency shelter and decreasing the number of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness.

The Navigation Center opened in November 2025 and has already seen a steady flow of clients seeking services from the variety of services providers located within. True North Housing Alliance, Inc. and Butte County Department of Employment and Social Services continue to remain connect to coordinate services and track data.

Description of Accomplishment

HHAP 2 helped fund the initial service costs for CHAT's Everhart Village, a local tiny home emergency shelter community for people experiencing homelessness and mental health disorders. Over many years of planning and coordination, CHAT was able to lease land from the County on a parcel next to the Department of Behavioral Health, utilize the flexibility in building regulations afforded by the Shelter Crisis Declaration, and fund raise of purchase and construction of 20 tiny homes. The last piece they were missing was funds to provide case management and onsite support to residents. Through the local procurement process, CHAT was awarded funds to help onboard and train staff in order to move in clients and initiate services. Through the program CHAT developed, they were able to leverage their success and obtain ongoing funding.

July 2022 to November 2025

Impact of Accomplishment

CHAT was able to build a program that provides shelter and services to individuals with the highest barriers and longest time spent homeless. Their program is already seeing considerable success, with 30% exiting to permanent housing.

Challenges

Challenge 1

Description of Challenge

Increased administrative burden with increased requirements, tracking, and monitoring. Administrative requirements have increased with each HHAP round; however, the administrative set-aside has not increased. Additionally, AB 977 obligated significant HMIS related requirements but does not include any funding.

Impact of Challenge

There is not enough administrative funding to both administer HHAP and ensure that subcontracted programs have the resources and supports they need to operate efficiently and effectively. Historically, HHAP administrative funds have been braided with other funds to ensure the workload could be managed, however, there has been a decrease in State and federal funds leading to a decrease in staffing.

In a medium-sized rural county, the subcontracted agencies have limited capacity and lean heavily on the administrative entity for support in building programs, understanding regulations, and program compliance. Additionally, there is not enough administrative funds to pass on any to subcontracted agencies so that they may build capacity.

Lesson Learned

It is important to have a cooperative relationship between the CoC and the CoC Lead Agency. The CoC at large should have more responsibility over the success of subcontracted programs instead of leaning

solely on the Lead Agency.

Challenge 2

Description of Challenge

Rural Challenges and limited local funds

Impact of Challenge

Many smaller and rural communities depend on HHAP as there are limited to no other funds available. For example, Butte only receives approximately \$800,000 annually in CoC and ESG funds, with expected decreases. The CoC regularly applies for CoC bonus funds to increase the annual renewal demand but is usually unsuccessful as the community is less competitive due to limited capacity and infrastructure. Additionally, the community has been ravaged by a multitude of natural disasters over the last decade, leading to a significant decrease in the General Fund - there are simply no local funds available to bolster existing programs nor prevent them from closing when funding is reduced.

Lesson Learned

The community has become adept in maximizing every dollar, which has led to really strong programs and services, but has also led to incredibly competitive procurement processes and a lot of infighting amongst historically cooperative agencies.

HMIS Reporting Requirement

As part of the HHAP reporting responsibilities, grantees are required to enter client data into their local Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) and to ensure that data is uploaded by their CoC to the statewide Homeless Data Integration System (HDIS) on a quarterly basis. Grantees must ensure proper recording of activities associated with these program funds, including the correct program and round, "Other Funder Code," and Grant Identifier ("Grant ID") for all HHAP-funded projects, as described in the [AB 977 HMIS Project Setup Instructions for HCD Grantees](#). Grantees are required to accept training and technical assistance in this area if their HMIS projects are not set up correctly. HCD may seek additional information directly from grantees to capture missing or incomplete HDIS data to support the annual or final reports.

This effort helps efficiently capture many of the grantees' non-fiscal reporting responsibilities. When grantees are properly reporting into HMIS, HCD can utilize that data to fulfill grantee reporting requirements. Review the persons-served data in the "Total Served" column to ensure that all projects are reporting, and capturing the person served correctly to the best of your knowledge. If you believe projects related to your award are missing, contact your HMIS lead and follow the project set up

instructions to add projects related to your award.

When data is properly reported it can be incorporated into the statewide HDIS system to improve our overall understanding of homelessness response and outcomes, and it will be displayed through program-specific dashboards so that HCD can comply with its data transparency requirements required by the Legislature related these programs.
