2B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project and how the Collaborative Applicant will use grant funds to comply with the provisions of 24 CFR 578.7.

The focus of this FY18 planning grant is to strengthen the Continuum of Care System. With a new fully funded full time Coordinator for our COC, the Board and leadership have a unique opportunity to focus on system wide processes, which include leadership and systems development. In our planning session we will explore how we can move from a reactive to a proactive role in our community. Additionally we will refine and finalize our CoC and ESG project evaluation methods and best practices, final testing and implementation of monitoring standards for CoC, ESG and other grant programs. Finally, we will improve our methods to increase access to our homeless or at risk of homelessness'.

Board and Service Provider Planning Sessions| The COC will engage a trained facilitator to conduct at least one planning and capacity building session. This will also include understanding how the CoC is an integral part of the consolidated plans for our jurisdictions. Agenda might include: clarification of current role with ideal role of the COC, strategies to streamline systems and processes to make meetings and operations more productive, development of a standard application process and group work to maximize board collaboration and leadership for the whole membership. These sessions will also focus on long term 10-15 years options for housing, diversion as solutions, education and advancement of data sharing within HMIS and CES agencies.

Project Evaluation | In an effort to build the capacity of our grantees, we will establish standard program evaluation efforts based on best practices. CoC Grantee agencies have had limited budgets, and time to test and finalize a standard project evaluation. It is understood HUD/HCD and other governmental agencies requirements will change over time. With this developed process, we will be able to make those changes with ease, as they become necessary.

Monitoring Tool | All government funded applications have developed a self-monitoring tool to ensure compliance with the required governmental body. This planning grant will enable the CoC to review all the individual monitoring tools for all the different programs and have a simple yet effective method that would allow for self- monitoring, on-site monitoring and intense monitoring. This grant will also be setting up a monitoring/mentor program for new grantees, to ensure compliance to HUD and other governmental agencies.

2. Describe the estimated schedule for the proposed activities, the management plan, and the method for assuring effective and timely completion of all work.

All of these activities will be overseen by the CoC Coordinator and reported on

at the CoC All Membership meetings. This funding will be used for activities, needed supplies, technical assistance, training program fees, as well as conference/education fees to learn about the ways to ensure our CoC is working toward the goal of Ending Homelessness for those who need our help. The Planning Session will be scheduled in accordance with the most availability as a first priority.

Both the evaluations and monitoring projects will be tested at the same time as our grantees are filing and reporting their annual APR's to HUD. This will also be the time the CoC coordinator shadows their current process. Since all grantees have different dates for reporting; testing and implementation can be done throughout this grant year.

Although a formal report will be given at the all member meetings, the CoC Coordinator will file a monthly report with the progress of these activities. This report will be sent to all CoC Council members.

All of these activities and events help our CoC see gaps in service and the positive outcomes of our projects. These funds will not only enable processes which will remain in place, with changes as deemed necessary, they will allow the CoC in future years to focus on solving the gaps. Understanding our local needs will assist the COC in developing fair and equitable outcome measures. Once these measures are uniform, our CoC will be able to communicate not only to our stakeholders about our positive process, but the results will be seen in the 2021 PIT count.

These activities are a blue print and road map for the CoC to follow in the coming years. These activities will serve our new leadership team and maximize our impact on the whole community to work together to end homelessness in our County.
