## >> SPECIAL POPULATIONS

### > HOMELESS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SURVIVORS



- 14% reported being a survivor of domestic violence
- 100% of survivors reported being unsheltered
- 100% of survivors are chronically homeless
- 50% of survivors are women

### > HOMELESS VETERANS

- 20% reported being a Veteran
- 100% of veterans reported being unsheltered
- 0% of veterans are chronically homeless
- 0% of veterans reported a chronic health disability
- 0% of veterans reported being Camp Fire survivors

### > HOMELESS YOUTH

- 100% of youth from 0 to 24 years old are unsheltered
- 0% of youth from 0 to 24 years old identify as LGBT

## >> LOCAL ISSUES



- 35% of survey participants have been approached by law enforcement because of laws about sitting, lying, camping, storing property, and other public actions which impact people who are experiencing homelessness. The result of those interactions were 40% warned, 20% arrested, 20% nothing, 20% ticketed, 0% asked to move along, 0% other, 0% property seized, and 0% incarcerated. When those who were approached by law enforcement were asked to identify the agency, 67% reported city or town police, 17% county sheriff, 17% park ranger, 0% parole officer and 0% other.

- 30% of all people experiencing homelessness in Gridley and Biggs reported being survivors of the Camp Fire and lived in Camp Fire affected areas. 100% of Camp Fire survivors experiencing homelessness in this area are unsheltered—47% of those report sleeping with a friend or family in their house or apartment, 29% in an outdoor encampment, 12% in the park, 12% on the street or sidewalk, 0% under a bridge/ overpass, 0% other, and 0% bus, train station, airport. Data shared with the CoC from FEMA indicated 993 survivors of the Camp Fire living in temporary FEMA housing on the day of the PIT count. The specific location of the temporary housing was not available to include in city summary level data.
