## Racial Equity

With the recent implementation of HDIS, the region has begun reviewing data for equitable outcomes. The local CoC has recently established an Equity Committee that is charged with overseeing, among other things, the equity in services provided and disparities in populations served. The CoC also strives to remain inclusive and reflective of the diversity of the population. Through this approach, the CoC continues to form partnerships with culturally diverse organizations.

## Findings

*What is the disparity and where is it occurring?*

**1. Describe the disparities you see among racial and ethnic groups of those experiencing homelessness in your community in comparison to the general housed population.**

Review of our local data shows that Black or African American and Native American or Alaskan Native are overrepresented in the homeless population and White Non-Hispanic/Non-Latino are underrepresented.

**2. In looking at the population of individuals experiencing homelessness within your community, describe the disparities you see among racial and ethnic groups of those more or less likely to receive homeless assistance.**

Based on known data as well as local knowledge, the Asian population is less likely to receive homeless assistance. The Asian population experiencing homelessness is significantly lower than their respective representation of the region's population as a whole. Local knowledge indicates that the Asian population experiencing homelessness is more likely to be doubled up in housing.

**3. In looking at the population of individuals experiencing homelessness within your community, describe the disparities you see among racial and ethnic groups of those more or less likely to have a positive housing outcome.**

Local data shows that of the population experiencing homelessness, Black or African American individuals are less likely to have positive housing outcomes.

## Partnerships

HHAP funding was designed to support regional coordination and partnership between jurisdictions to expand or develop local capacity to address homelessness challenges throughout the state. ### **1. Please share a successful partnership as a result of HHAP-1 funding and describe what made that partnership successful.**

The County subcontracted funds to a domestic violence service provider, Catalyst, for Navigation Coordination Services. Catalyst used funds to expand their team to include Navigation Coordinators to provide a collaborative approach to providing domestic violence services to those in need. As Catalyst has space limitations and not all those fleeing domestic violence will seek out a domestic violence specific shelter, Catalyst has leveraged HHAP-1 funds to provide trauma informed training to staff at collaborating shelters in the region to ensure a tactful and appropriate approach to domestic violence survivors. This training and coordination of services has led to Catalyst identifying participants of non-domestic violence specific shelters that have benefited from their services. Their services include counseling, advocacy, and secure housing.

### **2. Please share the most significant barrier(s) to HHAP-1 partnerships and any steps you took to mitigate the barrier(s).**

One of the significant barriers in partnership revolved around the overall demand. The County subcontracted HHAP-1 funds in a joint RFP with HHAP-2. Although the County was able to make \$2.5 million available to service providers, the amount of proposals received totaled \$11.8 million. The lack of other funding sources made the competition for HHAP funding incredibly competitive. Through coordination with the service providers that submitted proposals, many were willing to reduce the amount of their request through reducing staffing and/or reducing the length of time they would be able to provide services with contracted funds. Although all service providers are in need of funds, they all work together collaboratively to share funding when it becomes available.

### **3. If you received redirected HHAP-1 funding from another eligible jurisdiction, what strategies did you use to facilitate partnerships between jurisdictions? If you did not redirect or receive redirected HHAP-1 funding, what barriers prevented you from partnering with other jurisdictions to redirect or receive redirected funds?**

The local CoC redirected funds to the County. As the County is the Administrative Entity and Joint Applicant for the CoC, both agencies work closely together on a regular basis. In order to approach funding in a truly collaborative way, the County provides regular HHAP updates and seeks out input at CoC meetings on a regular basis.

The County and CoC are currently channeling energy and resources into data accuracy and interpretation. As this process continues, the region will have more clarity in gaps and needs as relates to the over services provided and in equitable outcomes.

The following projects are currently in process:

- \* Establishing community queues to better connect people with the most appropriate housing options (Permanent Supportive Housing, Temporary Housing, Shared Housing);
- \* Establishment of an Assessment Workgroup to revise the CES assessment tool to promote equity and data driven results;
- \* Developing a referral system so that Housing Navigators can more easily pull people from the community queues and get them into housing programs;
- \* Tracking of time between referrals and placement
