3B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

The project will provide permanent housing for three (3) homeless, unaccompanied adults with severe mental illness. The tenant based rental assistance will secure three (3) 1-bedroom units in sites scattered throughout Chico, Oroville, Town of Paradise, and Gridley. The Butte County Department of Behavioral Health (BCDBH) staff will perform outreach to persons who are homeless and experiencing symptoms of mental illness. BCDBH staff also responds to referrals from law enforcement, code enforcement, emergency homeless shelters, and Psychiatric Health Facilities that identify potential program participants. BCDBH participates in the CoC Coordinated Entry System.

BCDBH uses a housing first model. Our project policies do not screen out homeless persons on basis of rental, credit, or criminal histories. Further, we do not require service participation, sobriety or medication compliance. We do try to house participants as quickly as possible and after housed, engage them in services. Individuals who meet the eligibility criteria and are living in the streets may have access to temporary emergency shelter (motel designated as emergency shelter by BCDBH), while the participant completes the application process and identifies a rental unit with the case manager. Having the participant help identify a unit creates a vested interest and contributes to an individual's desire to remain in permanent housing. BCDBH contracts with our local Public Housing Authority to assist with determining rental assistance, conduct housing quality inspections, and send, via electronic process, monthly landlord payments.

BCDBH utilizes a recovery model approach to determine the day-to-day support services based on a clinical and functional assessment of the individual's needs. A case manager will collaborate with the participant to complete an action oriented supportive service plan. The plan is designed to assist the participant retain housing and develop a greater degree of self-sufficiency. The case manager and/or peer recovery specialist may provide the following volunteer based services and/or assist with referrals to community-based services:

- -Identify, secure, and maintain permanent housing
- -Obtain services: medical, dental, optical, mental health, employment and vocational training
- -Access community support services: education, transportation, libraries, and recovery support groups such as AA and NA
- -Advocacy regarding health benefits, disability and/or legal issues
- -Manage funds and/or develop budget skills
- -Develop independent living skills
- -Access mainstream benefits
- -Apply for Housing Choice Voucher Program and other affordable housing apartment complexes
