The Butte County Department of Employment and Social Services (DESS) is the Lead Agency and Collaborative Applicant for the Butte Countywide Homeless Continuum of Care (CoC). The Planning Grant proposal reflects goals and activities that will continue to promote an efficient and effective system. The focus areas include maintaining CoC operations and supporting the CoC application activities. The Planning Grant will continue to support the CoC infrastructure.
